



First steps in Identifying Academic Migration using Memento and Quasi-Canonicalization

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The Problem: HBCU faculty more prone to mobility

- Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) are the only institutions in the United States that were created for the express purpose of educating Black citizens. (*Gasman, 2013*)
- *Brown v. Board of Education*, HBCUs competing with non-HBCUs to attract and retain outstanding faculty, often losing the battle (*Seymore, 2005*)
- **Brain drain**: substantial exit of faculty who hold any expertise, considered valuable institutional assets (*Rosenblatt & Sheaffer, 2001*)
- Social mobility and civil rights movements in the past few decades have **accelerated academic mobility** (*Sugimoto, 2017*)

Thus, the need to investigate academic mobility of faculty at HBCUs is ever-increasing.


The *Ultimate* Goal: Identify Brain Drain

- Examine two forms of effects of academic mobility
 - Institution Level: measured in terms of the institutional human capital change at HBCUs
 - brain drains or gains
 - Individual Level: where the impact of academic moves on professors' research activities is assessed
- Collect faculty affiliation data from **35 HBCUs** with master's- or doctoral-level programs
- Conduct surveys to reveal
 - Factors that attract and retain faculty at HBCUs
 - Factors that made faculty leave HBCUs
- Follow up with two dozen in-depth interviews with HBCU faculty.

1. **Data collection, survey preparation, website creation**
2. Data cleaning, supplementation, and classification
3. Publication identification, survey identification, data publication
4. Professor productivity identification, pilot/distribute questionnaire, disseminate outputs
5. Professor modeling, follow-up interviews, visual dashboard creation
6. Regression testing, visualization dashboard dissemination, data dissemination, conclude interviews, present results



Project Methodology

- 
1. Collect faculty affiliation data from Internet Archive*
 2. Identify mobile and non-mobile professors who joined and left HBCUs
 3. Query professors' publications and citations in a local XML version of the Web of Science database
 4. Collect institution-level profiles from CCIHE (Carnegie Classification)
 5. Gather survey data
 6. Transcribe interview data

Building off the integrated data, we will employ historical comparisons, bibliometrics, and regression modeling for a clear and robust examination of academic mobility, institutional stratification, and the role of organizational factors in shaping academic mobility.

Results will help to better understanding HBCU faculty retention and mobility.

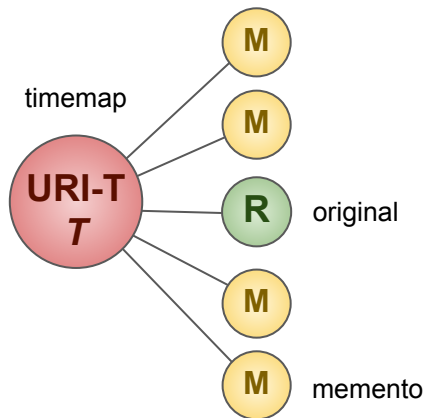

- Run from localhost



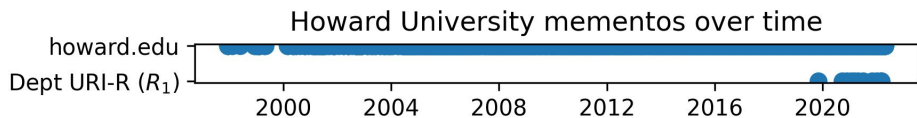

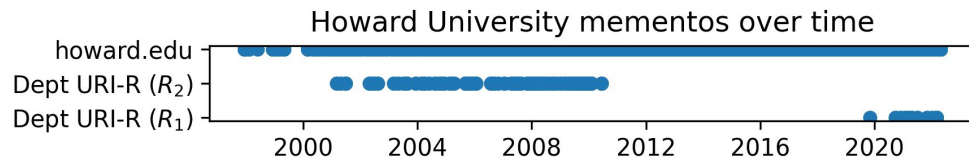

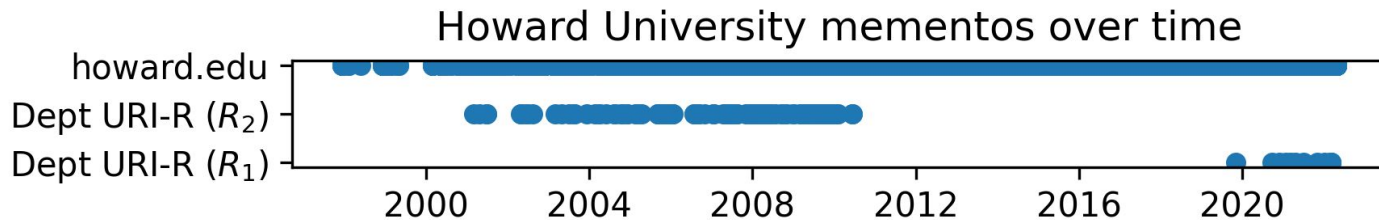
Our Approach, Step 2: Discover Old Depts' URI-Rs

- Start with 35 HBCU URI-Rs →
- Fetching TimeMaps
- Manually collect URI-Rs of depts on live web
- Get TimeMaps for departments
- Consult older URI-Ms of homepages
 - **DISCOVER** historical locations (URI-Rs) of depts
 - Ultimately use **this** as the basis for finding faculty's name and associations



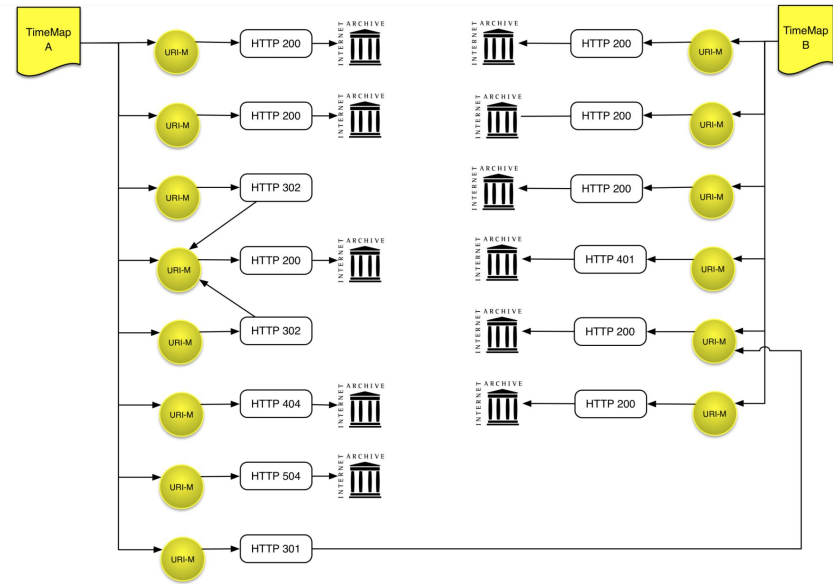
Quasi-Canonicalization

- Can we associate the prior URI-Rs of a dept together to get an accurate picture of the dept over time?
- What about departmental splitting, merging, creation, and disbandment?
- Typically, URI variations (example.com:80, www.example.com) are basis of association
 - Here: different URI-Rs represent the same dept. over time



Canonicalization Caveats

- HTTP/HTTPS transition
- Archived HTTP 3XXs
- Other patterns previously identified*

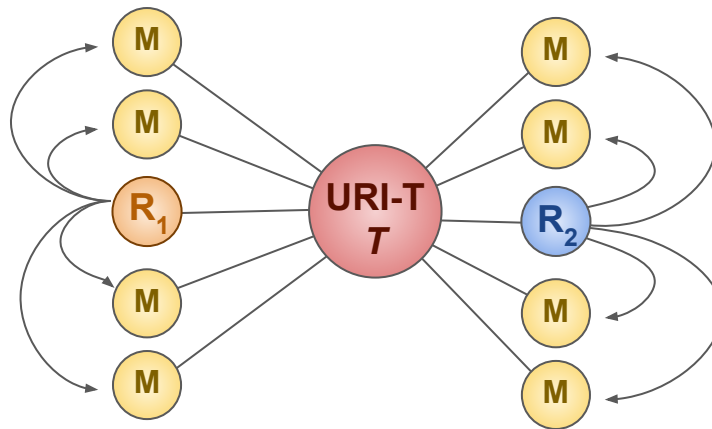
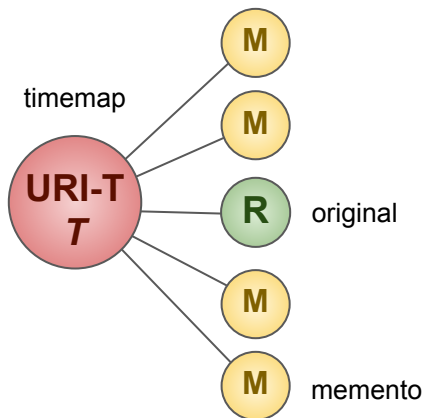
Premise & Hypotheses

- Identifying past departmental URI-R can act as basis for identifying faculty
 - (TBD)
- Anticipated faculty movement
 - Inter-university
 - Inter-department (at same university)
 - Leave academia
 - Other patterns to-be-explored



Memento-Compatible TimeMaps?

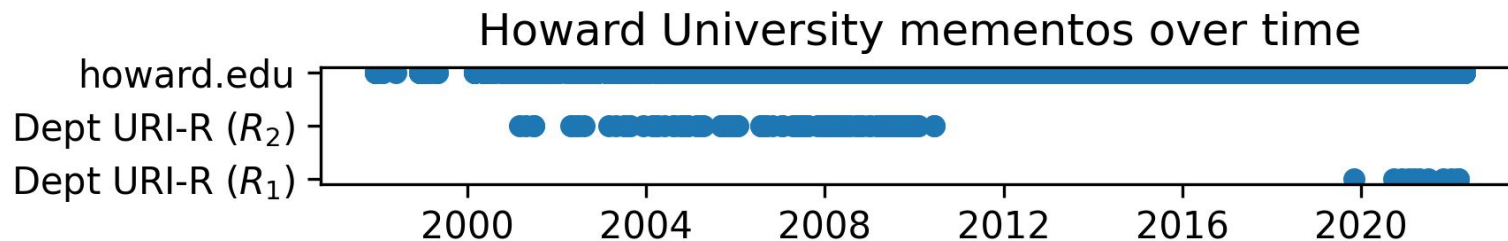
- Per-department TimeMap rather than (in addition to) per URI-R
- Maybe moot, as end-goal is to not serve these mementos





Memento-Compatible Navigation?

- Resolving URI-R to a past datetime beyond what is available
 - Perhaps URI-R₁ resided at URI-R₂
- The key might be in the “key”
 - URI-R as primary parameter could produce TimeMap containing URI-Ms that do not conventionally canonicalize, e.g., www.examples.com:80 → org,example)/



Ethics of Investigating this Public Data

- Balancing transparency (as required by NSF) and responsible data dissemination
 - What if faculty don't want to be identified? Public then \nRightarrow Free to use now
 - What sort of anonymization will be sufficient for findings dissemination?
 - Many other outstanding questions!
- Another study! But look to recent work by:
 - Tiidenberg 2018, Maemura 2018, Cilliers & Viljoen 2021, among others
